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Abstract

At the BME Training Reactor there are two types of entry permissions: permanent and occasional. Trainees arriving at the reactor are given occasional entry permit.

The occasional entry permit has to be signed by BME Institute of Nuclear Techniques (INT) employees, who are authorized by the Director of the BME INT. The occasional entry permit entitles the holder to a single entry, unless otherwise specified.

Persons authorized may affix the occasional entry permit with a clause extending its validity to a certain day, up to the end of that calendar year.

By signing the occasional entry permit, entrants also acknowledge the basic local security and radiation protection information.

1. Basic local security and radiation protection information

1. Pregnant women and persons under the age of 16 are not allowed to enter the controlled area of the reactor building.
2. Visitors and trainees under the influence of alcohol or other drugs are not allowed to enter the reactor building.
3. Eating, drinking and smoking is prohibited in the controlled area of the reactor building. University rules prohibit smoking in the entire building.
4. Coats and bags are not allowed in the controlled area of the reactor building. Such belongings must be left at the entrance.
5. Photography is not allowed in the reactor building, unless a permission is obtained from the University administration.
6. Wearing lab coats and shoe covers is required in the controlled area of the reactor building.
7. All visitors and trainees are required to check for radioactive contamination at the personal gate monitor when entering and leaving the controlled area of the reactor building.

8. All visitors and trainees are required to obey the orders of the supervisors and the reactor staff.
9. Stepping into closed areas is forbidden.
10. When leaving, the lab coat and the guest card (which are given prior to entering the controlled area) must be returned.
11. Guests and trainees have to execute all instructions of the supervisor and the staff of the reactor in an emergency situation.

In addition to the above mentioned rules, trainees performing hands-on experiments on the reactor or in the laboratories will be given basic knowledge of radiation protection, emergency procedures and security instructions according to the type and location of the specific experiment. Trainees have to sign a form about acknowledging these instructions.
